
TOMATOES - Early

| Type | Description |
|--|--|
| Ultimate Opener  | <p>Large, early tomato with sweet juicy flavor - Tasty new tomato developed by the same breeder of Early Girl, produces blemish-free fruits about a third larger than Early Girl.</p> <p>Produces throughout the summer!</p> <p>Highly Disease resistant, Indeterminate.</p> |





TOMATOES - Early and/or Container

| | |

| Glacier  | <p>Super early, light frost resistant heirloom - This tomato is sure to be a favorite! Produces both an early crop of 2 to 3 ounce red tomatoes and continues to bear the entire season.</p> <p>Potato-leaf plant is very cold tolerant, may survive a light frost.</p> <p>Suitable for container.</p> <p>Determinate.</p> |

TOMATOES - Big or Heirloom

| Big Beef  | <p>The perfect tomato - Colossal fruit of this AAS winner combines old-fashioned, rich flavor with a full spectrum of disease resistance.</p> <p>Smooth, globe-shaped fruit weigh 9 oz. to one pound.</p> <p>Indeterminate.</p> |

TOMATOES - Big or Heirloom

| Type | Description |
|---|--|
| <p>Red Brandywine</p>  | <p>Scarlet red, gourmet sister of Brandywine - This Amish heirloom that dates back to 1885 is generally considered to be the world's best-flavored tomato.</p> <p>Potato leaf plants with good yields of extra-large (weighing up to 1-1/2 lbs.), firm, clear-skinned, red fruits that grow in clusters of 4 to 6.</p> <p>Indeterminate.</p> |
| <p>Mortgage Lifter</p>  | <p>Popular favorite - Also called Radiator Charlie, this heirloom tomato was developed in the 1930's by an amateur gardener who paid off his mortgage by selling his seedlings for \$1 apiece. Produces huge (1 lb. to 3 lb.) pink-skinned fruit that are smooth, very meaty, with few seeds.</p> <p>Very flavorful, too!</p> <p>Indeterminate.</p> |
| <p>Cherokee Purple</p>  | <p>One of the best tasting heirloom tomatoes - This tomato was cultivated by Native American Cherokee tribe in Tennessee. Very productive plants produce loads of dusky rose to purple colored beefsteak tomatoes (12 oz.- 1 lb.). Fruits are round and crack-resistant.</p> <p>Exhibits tolerance to mild drought as well as to common diseases.</p> <p>Indeterminate.</p> |
| <p>Mr. Stripey</p>  | <p>Loudoun County Master Gardener taste test winner! - This heirloom plant has small leaves but produces large beefsteak fruits. It is uniquely colored, yellow near the stem and more red on the underside when ripe.</p> <p>These red and yellow-striped fruits are mild-flavored and low in acid.</p> <p>Indeterminate.</p> |






TOMATOES - Cherry

| Type | Description |

| <p style="text-align: center;">Sungold</p>  | <p>Luscious, bite-sized golden beauty - Overflowing with an abundance of fruits and flavor. Very early, ripening to a golden orange, Sungold is one of the sweetest tasting cherry tomatoes. Crops heavily and remains ripe and ready for picking over long periods.</p> <p>Disease resistant, indeterminate.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Supersweet 100</p>  | <p>The bonbons of the garden - Super sweet, bite-sized tomatoes are extra high in Vitamin C. Plant produces 100's of cherry tomatoes (hence the name) in clusters like grapes right up to frost. With adequate water, vigorous vines can grow to 10' or can be trained in a large planter to grow up to the eaves or down the railing.</p> <p>Disease resistant, indeterminate.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Black Cherry</p>  | <p>Unique, beautiful and tasty! - Super flavor! A <i>cherry tomato</i> with the flavor of the rich, dark, <i>black</i> tomatoes.</p> <p>The plant is similar in growth to other cherry tomatoes.</p> <p>Indeterminate.</p> |






TOMATOES - Canning and/or Sauce

| <p style="text-align: center;">San Marzano</p>  | <p>Unsurpassed for sauces, a Roma type tomato with superb flavor! - Considered by chefs to be the best sauce tomato in the world. San Marzano tomatoes are bright red and hang in large clusters. They hold well on the vine and in storage.</p> <p>Very meaty with few seeds.</p> <p>Perfect for canning and sauces!</p> <p>Indeterminate.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Juliet</p>  | <p>Most Stink Bug resistant tomato! - According to a University of Maryland Study, this tomato is the most resistant to stink bug damage. A large plum shaped cherry tomato that produces clusters of unusual, sweet-flavored glossy fruit. These 1 to 2 ounce, red-skinned fruits stay on the vine and don't crack.</p> <p>Good for salads, slicing, and sauces.</p> <p>Highly disease resistant, Determinate.</p> |






PEPPERS - Sweet

| Type | Description |

| <p style="text-align: center;">Ace</p>  | <p>This pepper has it all! - Early, hardy, prolific & full of vitamins A, C & E. Medium sized glossy green fruits with 3-4 lobes ripens to dark red. Resistance to blossom drop means all flowers bear fruit.</p> <p>If you have had problems in the past with peppers this is the one to grow.</p> <p>ACE is also well suited for container gardens.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Red Knight</p>  | <p>Red Knight - much improved version of the old standard "Fat N Sassy." - Early to turn red with large, blocky, thick-walled fruits. When red the taste is fruity and sweet.</p> <p>Great for salads, roasted, and in stir fried meals!</p> <p>Plant is open, compact, strong and does well in containers!.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Marconi</p>  | <p>Master Gardener Favorite - Fantastic yields with this deep red, extremely sweet, 7" horn shaped Italian heirloom pepper.</p> <p>Great for salads, frying, or drying. Flavor is sweet whether green or red.</p> <p>Vigorous plants bear loads of high quality fruit.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Early Sunstation</p>  | <p>The Earliest, biggest and brightest yellow bell ever! Starts out green and mature to a golden yellow. Wonderful crisp texture!</p> <p>Ultra-Sweet! Excellent for salads, stuffing or roasting!</p> <p>Suitable for containers, too.</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Sweet Banana</p>  | <p>One of the most popular non-bell sweet peppers - Excellent both fresh and cooked. Thick-walled fruits with sweet, mild, waxy flesh are prolifically produced on 16 to 24" plants with pendant fruits.</p> <p>Fruits start out a pale green, ripening to yellow, then red.</p> |






PEPPERS - Sweet

| Type | Description |

| <p style="text-align: center;">Carmen</p>  | <p>An All-American Selection! - An improved sweet pepper with a beautiful horn shape. Sweet flavor and high yield!</p> <p>Turns early to a ripe red! Sweetest when ripe red but sweet even when immature and green!</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Lipstick</p>  | <p>Lipstick Pepper - one of the most delicious sweet peppers ever! - Dark green fruits ripen to a rich, glossy red. Heavy early yields of 4" long x 2" wide peppers that taper to a blunt point even in a cool summer season.</p> <p>These tasty, thick, juicy, sweet peppers can be used in salads, salsa and cooking. Suitable for roasting, too .</p> |
| <h3>PEPPERS - Mildly Hot</h3> | |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Pizza Pepper</p>  | <p>Won blind taste test in MG kitchens - Cone shaped 3-4" peppers are mildly hot with just enough spark to spice up any dish.</p> <p>Plants bear loads of fruit with very heavy walls, making them ideal for slicing.</p> <p>Hottest when green; milder as mature to red.</p> |
| <h3>PEPPERS - Hot</h3> | |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Cayenne Large Red</p>  | <p>Traditional pungent, hot flavor! - This dark red pepper grows into a curled or twisted shape.</p> <p>The long slender peppers dry easily.</p> <p>Great for pickling, sauces or drying!</p> <p>Can be used to thread on a string or to make colorful wreaths!</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Mucho Nacho</p>  | <p>Mucho impressive jalapeno with a powerful taste - Jumbo 4" fruits are fatter, thicker, heavier, a bit hotter, and an inch longer than regular jalapenos.</p> <p>High yields, matures from green to red.</p> |

OTHER VEGETABLES

| Type | Description |
|--|---|
| <p>Tavor Artichoke</p>  | <p>Tavor is an Imperial Star-type bred to produce in just one season! - Tavor produces 7-8 thornless green globes up to 4" in diameter.</p> <p>With their unique foliage artichokes also make beautiful ornamental bedding plants, too!</p> |
| <p>Broccoli Packman</p>  | <p>Early maturing, high yield - Packman quickly produces a large, sage-green central head that can be 9" across. After the central head is cut, side shoot production continues well into summer.</p> <p>Delicious, attractive veggie full of antioxidants.</p> |
| HERBS | |
| <p>Basil African Blue</p>  | <p>Distinctive , gorgeous basil - A basil that has decorative blue-tinted green leaves and purple veining. Impressive tall spikes of lavender pink flowers are present all summer. Not as strong flavored as most basil, with a hint of camphor.</p> <p>Great container plant.</p> <p>Adapts well to indoor conditions so can be overwintered by bringing plant in or making cuttings in fall.</p> |
| <p>Basil Genovese</p>  | <p>One of the best for true Italian flavor - Bushy habit and large, slightly wrinkled leaves.</p> <p>It is slower to bolt than some other varieties.</p> <p>Sometimes called "the pesto basil" for its excellent taste which is milder than most basil.</p> |
| <p>Greek Columnar Basil</p>  | <p>Unique upright columnar shape - Great basil flavor and produces abundant foliage on tall plants.</p> <p>Good for stews and hearty dishes.</p> <p>No flowers to pinch off!</p> |

HERBS - (Continued)

| Type | Description |

| <p>Cilantro Calypso</p>  | <p>The most bolt-resistant Cilantro ever! - A fragrant mix of parsley and citrus flavors. Flavor is used to “lift” and enhance other flavors. Calypso yields a continuous profusion of lovely ‘cut and come again’ leaves.</p> <p>A must for your Middle Eastern, Mexican and Asian cooking!</p> |
| <p>Parsley, Italian Flat</p>  | <p>Flat and deeply cut leaves on very tall, stocky stems.</p> <p>The aromatic flavor makes it our best parsley for drying or freezing.</p> |
| <p>Rosemary ARP</p>  | <p>About as hardy as rosemary gets - Arp can survive down to zone 5 with minimal protection. This means savory, fresh rosemary all year long! Arp has pale blue flowers that bloom mid-summer through fall, and tease the senses with a hint of lemon fragrance. Airy green-gray foliage. Reaching 4 feet tall.</p> <p>Arp makes a great border or mass planting.</p> |
| <p>Thyme, Golden Variegated</p>  | <p>Scented ground cover and lemony herb flavor - This culinary herb’s lemon flavor is delicious in fruit salad and other summer dishes.</p> <p>Plant is very drought tolerant and can be used as a profusely-blooming ground cover.</p> <p>Green leaves have scattered yellow edges.</p> |
| <p>Fernleaf Dill</p>  | <p>Fernleaf Dill is a native, early, compact dill - Growing to only 18" tall, Fernleaf dill has finely divided fern-like dark-green leaves.</p> <p>Slow to bolt and especially suitable for containers.</p> |
