Dear Master Gardener Volunteer Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the Loudoun County Master Gardener Volunteer Program. Master Gardener Volunteers serve the citizens of Loudoun County by educating the public in horticulture matters. They assist the County Cooperative Extension Office in providing research-based horticulture information, educational programs, and plant diagnostic services to the public. Volunteers:

- Handle telephone, email, and walk-in inquiries at the Extension Office (the Master Gardener Volunteer Help Desk Office);
- Grow a Demonstration Garden (our teaching garden) at Ida Lee Park in Leesburg;
- Provide educational programs to community groups and answer gardening questions at Gardening Clinics and other activities/events in the County.

The one-year training program for Master Gardener Volunteers consists of approximately 60 hours of classroom learning and 75 hours of hands-on, practical Internship service to the Extension Office through the Master Gardener Volunteer program. The 75-hour Internship requirement is comprised of:

- 25 hours of staffing the Help Desk Office, under the guidance of an experienced Master Gardener Volunteer; 9 of these hours may be spent staffing Gardening Clinics;
- 25 hours of gardening in the Demonstration Garden, under the guidance of the Demonstration Garden Team;
- 25 hours in other activities, for example: Gardening Clinics, Leesburg Flower & Garden Festival, Spring and Fall Farm Tours, Arbor Day, Bluemont Fair.

After completing these requirements, the Intern is certified as a Virginia Cooperative Extension Master Gardener.

The cost to apply for this program is **\$200 for Earlybird Registration** (received by November 1, 2010) or **\$225 for applications received after November 1, 2010**. The check should be made payable to "Loudoun County Master Gardener Association (LCMGA)" and must accompany your application. This fee covers the cost of training. Checks for those individuals not accepted for this training class will be destroyed (or returned if so directed). If you are interested in becoming a Master Gardener Volunteer, please fill out the enclosed application and return it to our office (save money by meeting the Earlybird registration deadline!). Please make sure you include the Contract that you are asked to read and sign so that we know you understand the commitment you are asked to make when accepted into this program. Only a limited number of applicants are accepted in order to ensure the class is the appropriate size so Trainees receive individual attention. Important dates you need to know:

- **August 26, 7 pm** - "So You Want to be a Master Gardener Volunteer?" – general information program about the MGV program with presentation and question and answer session, Loudoun Extension Office, 30 Catocin Circle SE (Wachovia Bank Building), Suite B, Leesburg, call 703-777-0373 to register.
- **August 31, 7 pm** - "So You Want to be a Master Gardener Volunteer?" – repeat of August 26, Dulles South Multipurpose Center, 24950 Riding Center Drive, South Riding, call 703-777-0373 to register.
- **November 22, 7 pm** - Open House for MGV Program Applicants – Social to meet current active MGV and learn more about the program from them directly, Loudoun Extension Office, 30 Catocin Circle SE, Suite B (Wachovia Bank Building), Leesburg, call 703-777-0373 to register. **Applicants will be asked to schedule their interview at the Open House, November 22.**
- **November 29 & 30 & December 1, 6, & 7, 9 am** - Interviews for candidates who submitted completed applications will commence. Successful candidates will be notified of their acceptance before Christmas.
- **February 1, 2011, 9 am** – 2011 training class begins; we begin promptly each day at 9 am. Make up days are worked into the training schedule in case of inclement weather.
- **April 18-22, 2011** – Spring Break
- **April 28, 2011** – Last day of training, transition to MGV Intern, luncheon celebration

When you are accepted into the Master Gardener Volunteer Program you begin by attending the initial classroom training program. This includes the following topics: botany, soils & fertilizer, entomology propagation, communications, vegetables, fruits, turf, woody plants, herbaceous plants, water quality, pruning, plant pathology, plant damage diagnosis, pesticides, landscape design, and internship. The text for the course will be The Virginia Master Gardener Handbook. The registration fee includes the cost of the handbook, the Loudoun County Master Gardener Volunteer Redbook, a Virginia Pest Management Guide (PMG) – Home Grounds & Animals (included as part of the LCMGV Redbook), a handlen, membership to the Virginia Master Gardener Association (state association for Master Gardeners), and a LCMGV t-shirt. The manuals and PMG, reflect the emphasis and time that is dedicated to plant pathology and insect identification and diagnosis and protecting the environment when using pesticides.

Classroom training is scheduled to begin February 1, 2011, and will be completed in mid to late April. ***We do take Spring Break at the same time as Loudoun County Public Schools.*** Training classes are Tuesday and Thursday mornings beginning promptly at 9:00 a.m. in the Extension Office downstairs conference room at 30 Catocin Circle, SE (Wachovia Bank Building), Suite B, Leesburg. Most classes generally end at noon. However, there are ***several classes with hands-on activities or that are held off-site that may continue into the afternoon.*** Propagation, Pruning, Help Desk Training, and Internship are examples of classes that may extend into the afternoon. In addition, there will be several optional opportunities to stay after class for a brown bag lunch where experienced Master Gardener Volunteers will be on hand to discuss and answer questions about the Help Desk Office, the Demonstration Garden, other Internship activities and events, as well as general gardening questions.

Loudoun County Master Gardener Volunteer Contract

As a participant in the Loudoun County Master Gardener Volunteer Program, I agree to:

1. Attend all classroom training sessions, February to April 2011. You may be asked to withdraw from the program if you miss more than one class.
2. Serve a 75-hour internship of continued learning:
 - 25 hours on the Master Gardener Help Desk,
 - 25 hours in the Demonstration Garden, and
 - 25 hours in other approved Master Gardener Volunteer activities.
3. Abide by the following rules and regulations:
 - a) Answer horticultural questions in accordance with the principals taught in Master Gardener Training;
 - b) Identify myself as a “Master Gardener” only when performing volunteer service;
 - b) Abstain from using the title “Master Gardener” in promoting myself or any commercial organization or enterprise;
 - c) Offer pesticide recommendations only as stated in the Virginia Cooperative Extension Pest Management Guide Home Grounds & Animals or as directed by a Virginia Cooperative Extension Agent.

Note: Master Gardener Certification is only valid when you are participating in a Virginia Cooperative Extension Master Gardener sponsored program or activity; and only when you have met the state and local requirements to maintain status as an active Master Gardener Volunteer.
